National School Lunch Program (2022-23)

Background Information... The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is a federally assisted program operating in public and nonprofit private schools and residential child care institutions. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost, or free lunches to children each school day. The program was established under the National School Lunch Act, signed by President Harry S. Truman in 1946.

School lunch is served every day in all five of our school buildings. Last year, school lunch was free for all students. This year, your student will be charged for lunch unless your family qualifies for a free or reduced-price lunch. In order to qualify for a free or reduced-price lunch, families must fill out the application found on the link below. Our Food Service Department will let you know if your children qualify for free or reduced-price lunches.

Eligibility Requirements... Children may be determined “categorically eligible” for free meals through participation in certain Federal Assistance Programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or based on their status as a homeless, migrant, or foster child. Children can also qualify for free or reduced-price school meals based on household income and family size. For reduced-price lunches, schools may not charge children more than 40 cents for a reduced-price lunch. How to Apply... Please follow the instructions listed on the application to help you fill out the free or reduced-price meal form. You only need to submit one application per household, even if your children attend more than one school in the Haslett School District. The application must be filled out completely to certify your children for free or reduced-price meals. When filling out the application, be sure to answer all questions.
