This fall has been busy, but wonderful, as we get back into classrooms and enjoy extra-curricular activities together, building relationships to make Haslett High School a place where all students can learn.

Haslett High School has a variety of supports to help students be successful. From collaborative discussions to modeling, staff use different **engagement strategies** during instruction to reach all learners. Staff are also available to students for one-on-one extra help. In addition, teachers post their assignments to Google Classroom so that everything is organized in one place.

Supplementary resources, examples, video tutorials, and online textbooks are posted to support students as they work on homework and projects. Our National Honor Society offers free tutoring in the Media Center after school Monday-Thursday as well.

The counseling staff has been meeting with our seniors to make sure each student has a path after high school. The **Building Leadership Team** continues to monitor students' progress towards graduation and offer encouragement and develop plans for improvement with students who need a boost. We can also refer families to resources outside of the district that may be helpful (tutoring, food and clothing, and mental health support). We truly value each and every student and endeavor to provide them an avenue to success.
